# Farming in Protected Landscapes programme





- provide a range of habitats for an array of wildlife
- support rural communities attracting 260 million visitors per year
- play an important role in our health and wellbeing

The programme opened in July 2021 and runs until March 2025

# It will fund projects that:

- Support nature recovery
- Mitigate the impacts of climate change
- Provide opportunities for people to discover, enjoy and understand the landscape and its cultural heritage
- Support nature-friendly, sustainable farm businesses

# The four themes

• **Climate:** Including reduced flood risk and more carbon stored / sequestered

land in the application and have control of the

activities you're proposing (or written consent).

- **Nature:** Including greater habitat connectivity and biodiversity
- People: Including greater public engagement in land management
- **Place:** Including conserving historic structures

Your project must also support the priorities of your protected landscape.



## **Funding**

If you won't make commercial gain from the project, you could get up to 100% of the costs – otherwise, a proportion of the costs.

You can be in other schemes but won't be paid twice for the same work. If your project is the same as a Countryside Stewardship (CS) activity, you will be paid the same as the CS rate. e.g. fencing.

If not, you'll be offered funding on the estimated costs.

Projects under £5K will normally be assessed by a senior AONB officer.

Projects over £5K will go to a local panel which will meet once every 6-8 weeks.

Minimum grant £2K

# **Example projects:**

- promoting connectivity between habitats
- replacing stiles with gates on public footpaths
- conserving historic features on a farm
- supporting a locally branded food initiative that promotes the links between the product and the landscape in which it is produced
- action to reduce carbon emissions on a farm
- Whole farm planning for conservation, energy efficiency and economic resilience, including in farmer clusters

- The FiPL Officer will visit you at the project site to offer advice and help.
- Submit your application as soon as it's ready.
- Multi-year awards are possible but all projects must be delivered and claimed for by March 2025.
