Minutes committee meeting held
26 July 2021, 4.30pm

1. Apologies: P Crawford, N Hurrell, J Le Grice and S Woodford.

2. Minutes of previous meetings were agreed and signed.

3. Covid Rules

A notice will be displayed as to how we want to proceed going forward. Even though masks are no longer mandatory we would be obliged if they are worn when people move around. The individual clubs will probably have their own rules.

4. Events for 2022.

Tim Kliphaus - discussed whether his visit in January would be a viable event as it would need to be well attended. Chris will send a round robin to obtain people's opinions and ask if they would prefer an afternoon performance.

Autumn Fair - a preliminary meeting has been held by the sub-committee. Diane has spoken with the Museum to find out what they do and also looked at forums to find out what vendors require, but we need more information. Looking at the size of the hall we can accommodate about 8 double tables, which is similar to last time. Another meeting will be held once a convenient time is found.

4. Treasurer's Report.

Quarter 2

Income

Bank Interest for the quarter amounted to £1.39. We gained a new car parking permit for Vine Cottage for a charge of £48 for the remainder of the year to March 31st 2022. The Feed in Tariff generated £888.38. The June rental for the Main Hall amounted to £245 and for the Yeo Room £40. We hired out 3 tables to Anthony Parker-Swift for £6. Village Voice Magazine paid £7.20 for their share of the Zoom subscription.

Expenditure

The total payment in quarter 2 for Devon Maids was £273.00 with an additional £38.39 on cleaning materials. £6 was paid to Chris White for a ceramic cartridge from Kingsbridge Plumbing. The Zoom subscription for June was £14.39.

Quarter 3

We have no income as yet.

Expenditure

New Equipment £1.49 for a Gang Blank Plate. Caretaker - £126 - 3 weeks @ £42. Telephone & Internet - £26.99 + £1.52 on calls totalling £28.51. Electricity is still £1 per month. Quarterly water rates £87.41. Repairs £89.40 for boiler service. Subscription - £28.78 (shared with Village Voice).

Juliette Atkin donated a £50 gift aid cheque which has been sent off to be credited to our current account.

A £60 profit was made in Q2. £175 still outstanding from the RNLI.

Do we cancel the Zoom subscription now we can meet in person; this will be discussed with Village Voice?

5. Maintenance Committee Report.

Nothing much to report. There was one minor issue when the cleaner had a problem with switching on the water heater, this tripped a switch affecting the lights and the socket used for the vacuum as they are on the same circuit.

6. A.O.B

- **First Aid Class** - approached about holding courses for first aid on children, that targets parents and grandparents, we are still waiting for a reply.
- **Facebook** - should the hall look into finding someone who would set up and be responsible for a Facebook page to help advertise events etc. we may have to resort to this in future to attract younger people of the community. A piece will go in VV in the next issue.
- **Black Box**- Chris showed us the black box containing the modal car, he has been unable to find out who left it and why. It will be mentioned in the current edition of the VV to see if anything comes of that.
- **Bridge** - they might be returning in September; it was suggested they start on a Wednesday evening to see what happens.
